

2022 Educators Rising Missouri Competition Requirements Outline

Detailed competition information, requirements and scoring guides can be accessed on the national Educators Rising website, usually in August, at <https://www.educatorsrising.org>, under [Student Resources](#). Students may enter up to two events. If a student is a presenter for a chapter competition, that counts as an event entry. All students entering a Missouri competition must pay 2021-2022 national dues of **\$10 by Oct. 31, 2021**.

Each chapter bringing students to compete needs to recruit and bring a judge. Judges must be able to access materials from the internet before the event and join an online judges training before the conference. Details at www.mnea.org/edrising after Oct. 1. Judges can be current college students.

All students competing must also register to attend the conference by Friday, Jan. 14 at www.mnea.org/edrising. **Conference registration fee is TBD.** All students competing must complete online entry form by midnight, Jan. 14, form available by Nov. 15. By Tues., Jan. 25, all materials to be submitted in advance must be emailed to Laurie.Bernskoetter@mnea.org. Those files should be labeled with the following format: LastName.FirstInitial.competition.material.2022. Example: Jarrett.A.ExplAdmin.Interview.2022.

Entrants grant Missouri National Education Association, the state coordinator of Educators Rising Missouri, the right to post photos of students for promotional purposes on websites, social media, and printed materials. Entrants may not make any requests about their competition time. Competitions will be March 8 from 5-9 p.m. and March 9 from 8 to 10 a.m.

Students cannot be a spectator in their competition at any time during the conference. Please do not enter or leave a room during presentations, only between presentations. Competitions closed to spectators are noted the table below.
