Higher Wages For Education Professionals

On average, Missouri NEA members who bargain contracts earn more than educators in non-bargaining districts.

Missouri NEA represents employees in 75 percent of the top 20 highest-paying districts. Missouri NEA bargains for members in 15 of the 20 highest-paying school districts in the state. In districts where Missouri NEA bargains, educators earn an average salary of \$67,934, 44 percent higher than Missouri's average salary of \$46,944.





Education Support Personnel

Missouri NEA bargains for ESPs in a variety of roles, including paraprofessionals. transportation, culinary services, and custodial. While each bargaining unit has its own priorities across the state. Missouri NEA and its affiliates have bargained substantial pay and benefit increases for ESP workers.





Networking




Classroom Support

Financial Compensation

Teachers, paraprofessionals, nurses bargained a three-year salary agreement totaling 13% salary increase.

Three days of release time for conferences and IEPs. Teachers bargain 300 minutes/week of teacher-directed plan time.





Duty Free Lunch

Respect: teachers bargain a duty free lunch.

Custodians represented by Missouri NEA bargained a three-year agreement that covers transfers, paid leave, shift assignments, seniority, vacation scheduling and more.
