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Executive Summary

This Data Book provides a detailed state-by-state look at the Education Support Professionals (ESP) in our nation's public schools and colleges. The chapters to follow, taken together, present a complete state and national level picture of the current ESP work force, in size, characteristics, and geographic distribution.

Key Findings, Total ESP

- Nearly 3.1 million ESP work in the nation's public schools and colleges, with 75 percent employed at the K-12 level.
- Paraeducators (36%) and clerical service ESP (22%) are the largest career families.
- California, Texas, and New York lead in numbers of total ESP.
- The average ESP is 45 years old.
- Sixty-nine percent of all ESP are female.
- Minority workers make up 41 percent of ESP, with Hispanics at 19 percent, Blacks at 14 percent, Asians at 4 percent, Native Americans at 1 percent, and Native Hawaiians/Pacific Islanders at two tenths of a percent of the nation's ESP. Three percent of the total ESP work force reports more than one race.
- Eighty-three percent of the nation's ESP live in households earning at least \$45,000 per year.

Full-Time ESP

- Over 2.3 million ESP, 76 percent of the total, work full time.
- California, Texas, New York, and Florida lead in numbers of full-time ESP.

K-12 ESP

- Nearly 2.3 million K-12 ESP work in the nation's public schools.
- Paraeducators, clerical services, and custodial services are the largest K-12 ESP career families.
- More than half of K-12 ESP work at least 40 hours per week.

Higher Ed ESP

- Nearly 790,000 ESP work in higher education.
- Thirty-eight percent of Higher Ed ESP are in clerical services.
- In general, Higher Ed ESP are younger, have a higher share working at least 40 hours, and have higher educational attainment than K-12 ESP.

Earnings in 2022–2023

- The 2022–2023 average earnings for the full-time ESP work force are \$35,995.
- Full-time K-12 ESP have average earnings of \$33,756 in 2022–2023.
- The average earnings for full-time higher education ESP are \$44,898.
- The District of Columbia, Delaware, New Jersey, Alaska, Connecticut, and California lead in average earnings for full-time ESP.

Suggested Uses

These data can be helpful for those interested in the most current view of the ESP work force, at both the national and individual state level.

- How many are employed as ESP?
- How do the career families differ in size?
- How does the size of the work force differ between the K-12 and higher education levels?
- Who are ESP?
- Are they predominantly young or old?
- Male or female?
- How many minorities are there?
- What kind of income do ESP and the households in which they reside earn?
- How many hours do they work?

These and many other questions can be answered with the information in these chapters.

- Chapter 1 presents the 2022–2023 average earnings estimates for full-time K-12 ESP.
- Chapter 2 examines the 2021 K-12 ESP work force in detail, at the state level.
- Chapter 3 is a detailed state-by-state profile of the 2021 K-12 ESP population, based on demographic, socioeconomic, and labor force characteristics.
- Chapter 4 gives demographic details on 2021 K-12 ESP, broken down by career family.
- Chapters 5 through 8 present corresponding information for Higher Ed ESP.
- Chapters 9 through 12 present corresponding information for all ESP.

Data Sources

The profiles in this Data Book are based on the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey (ACS). The ACS is a large, continuously-collected, nationwide sample survey, designed to replace the long form questionnaire of the decennial census. Begun in 2005, the ACS now samples three million households per year. From these households, individual level data for about 1.3 million households is available each year to analysts for tabulations such as presented in this Data Book.

By combining public educator extracts from data years 2019 through 2021, a sample large enough to accurately measure ESP on a state basis was created. A sample of about one out of every 50 people in the country is included in the Public Use files for those years, resulting in about 90,000 ESP data records for the 2019–2021 period. Tabulations of that sample in this Data Book are inflated to represent the total ESP population of the country. Estimates of 500 or fewer ESP shown in a table could represent an underlying sample of fewer than 10 people. Thus, basing any decision or interpretation on estimates of under 2,500 people is not recommended.

In Chapters 1, 5, and 9, counts and percentages of full-time ESP earnings within dollar categories are tabulated from 2019–2021 ACS. Earnings *averages* are tabulated using five years of ACS data (2017–2021), to mirror the methodology used to create the annual report *NEA Estimates and Projections of Average Earnings and Size of the National Full-Time ESP Work Force*, published by NEA. All earnings data have been adjusted to 2022 dollars, and are termed 2022–2023 to reflect the academic calendar.

2022–2023 Earnings of the Full-Time K-12 ESP Work Force

Earnings are shown for **K-12 ESP who work full time**, defined by NEA Research as 30 or more hours per week. Earnings of full-time ESP are used in the annual updates of ESP earnings published by NEA. Full-time earnings are also used as a standard to compare occupations, since this restriction allows for direct comparisons across career families. For example, many more food service ESP are part-time than are technical services ESP. Earnings are expressed in 2022 dollars.

Full-Time K-12 ESP Earnings


Figure 1-1**Earnings Rankings for Full-Time Workers

Figure 1-1 and Table 1-1 show the 2022–2023 average earnings for the full-time K-12 ESP work force, ranked by state.

- Average earnings for the national K-12 ESP full-time work force are \$33,756.
- Full-time K-12 ESP in 20 states and the District of Columbia have earnings above the national average, and those in 30 states below.
- Full-time K-12 ESP in Delaware lead in average earnings at \$44,237, followed by the District of Columbia at \$44,098, Alaska at \$42,118, New Jersey at \$41,338, and Connecticut at \$40,285. Full time K-12 ESP average nearly \$40,000 in California and New York.
- Full-time K-12 ESP in Oklahoma, Idaho, and Mississippi have the lowest average earnings, at under \$27,000.

Tables *1-2a* and *1-2b* show the distributions of earnings for full-time K-12 ESP by state, represented by counts and percentages.

- Thirty-nine percent of full-time K-12 ESP have average earnings of \$35,000 or more.
- Thirteen percent of full-time K-12 ESP have average earnings below \$15,000.

The 2021 K-12 ESP Work Force

In this chapter, data are shown for two different groups of K-12 ESP: all K-12 ESP regardless of hours worked, and full-time K-12 ESP who work at least 30 hours per week. Full-time and part-time status is based on the usual hours worked per week in the previous 12 months.

All K-12 ESP





Figure 2-2**Work Force Percentage of National Total

Figures 2-1 and 2-2 show the size and relative percentages of the entire K-12 ESP work force, by state.

- California leads the country in numbers of K-12 ESP, with 12 percent of the national K-12 ESP work force. Texas contributes 10 percent and New York eight percent of the total.
- The top nine states constitute 50 percent of the national K-12 ESP work force: California, Texas, New York, Florida, Illinois, Georgia, Ohio, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania.

All K-12 ESP, by Career Family

Table 2-1a gives the size of the K-12 ESP career families nationally and in each state.

- Nearly 2.3 million K-12 ESP work in the nation's public schools.
- Paraeducators are the largest career family, at 938,714.
- Clerical personnel are next with 370,182.
- Custodial services account for 350,190.
- Food services employ 251,846.
- California or Texas lead in numbers for nearly every career family, generally followed by New York and Florida.

Nationally, the top two career families account for over half of K-12 ESP, as shown in *Table 2-1b*.

- Paraeducators have 41 percent of the total.
- Clerical personnel make up 16 percent.
- Custodial services add 15 percent.
- Food services are another 11 percent.
- Transportation ESP account for nine percent.
- Technical, trades, security, and health and student services together make up the remaining eight percent.
- This same general pattern is found at the state level, with the highest percentages of K-12 ESP in the paraeducator, clerical, and custodial career families.

Full-Time K-12 ESP


Figure 2-3**Percentage Full-Time****K-12 ESP Work Force by State, 2021**

Figure 2-3 and Tables 2-2a and 2-2b give the counts and percentages of full-time K-12 ESP by state.

- Eighty percent of the nation's K-12 ESP work at least 30 hours per week.
- In 11 states and the District of Columbia, 85 percent or more of K-12 ESP are full-time workers.
- South Carolina, Oklahoma, and Texas have the highest percentages of full-time K-12 ESP, at or above 89 percent, after the District of Columbia at 93 percent.
- Utah has the lowest percentage of full-time K-12 ESP, at 47 percent.
- Texas leads with 203,644 full-time K-12 ESP.
- More than half of the nation's full-time K-12 ESP work force is concentrated in nine states: Texas, California, New York, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Ohio, New Jersey, and Virginia.

**Hours Worked,
All K-12 ESP**


Figure 2-4**Average Hours Worked****K-12 ESP Work Force by State, 2021**

Figure 2-4 shows the average hours worked by all K-12 ESP, by state.

- The national K-12 ESP work force averages 35 hours of work per week.
- K-12 ESP in Texas, Mississippi, and the District of Columbia lead in average hours worked per week, at 38 hours.
- Overall, K-12 ESP in nine states and the District of Columbia average 37 or more hours per week.
- K-12 ESP in Utah work the fewest hours per week, 28 hours on average.

Tables 2-3a and 2-3b give the distribution of K-12 ESP and hours worked in counts and percentages, by state.

- Nationally, 54 percent of K-12 ESP work at least 40 hours per week.
- Twenty-six percent work between 30 and 39 hours per week.
- Twenty percent work fewer than 30 hours per week.
- After the District of Columbia at 10 percent, nine percent of K-12 ESP in six states led by Kansas and South Carolina work 45 or more hours per week.
- Fifty-three percent of K-12 ESP in Utah work fewer than 30 hours per week.

K-12 ESP by State, 2021

K-12 ESP by State, 2021**

Demographics of the 2021 K-12 ESP Work Force

Age


Figure 3-1**Average Age****K-12 ESP Work Force by State, 2021**

Figure 3-1 and Tables 3-1a and 3-1b show the average and distribution of ages of the total K-12 ESP work force, by state.

- The national K-12 ESP work force averages 48 years old.
- Forty-four percent of K-12 ESP are between age 35 to 54.
- Seven percent are under 25.
- Nine percent of K-12 ESP are 65 years of age or older.
- Eight states, led by Virginia, Pennsylvania, and New Jersey, have K-12 ESP work forces with average ages of at least 50 years old.
- K-12 ESP in Utah, Alaska, and the District of Columbia average less than 44 years of age.

Gender


Figure 3-2**Gender: Percentage Female****K-12 ESP Work Force by State, 2021**

Figure 3-2 and Tables 3-2, 3-3a, and 3-3b present gender and age data for the total K-12 ESP work force, by state.

- Seventy-three percent of the total K-12 ESP work force is female.
- At least 78 percent of K-12 ESP in Tennessee, Michigan, Louisiana, and Kansas are female; at least 75 percent of K-12 ESP in 13 other states are female.
- Montana, Alaska, and Maine have the highest percentages of male K-12 ESP at more than 35 percent; at least 30 percent of K-12 ESP in eight other states are male.
- In general, male K-12 ESP are younger than female K-12 ESP. Twenty-five percent of males are under 35 years old, versus 18 percent of females.
- The gender by age distribution of K-12 ESP in individual states generally mirrors the national pattern.

Race/Ethnicity

Figure 3-3 and Tables 3-4a and 3-4b show the racial-ethnic composition of the K-12 ESP work force, by state.

- Minority workers make up 42 percent of the nation's K-12 ESP work force.
- Hispanics comprise the largest proportion, at 21 percent.
- Blacks account for 15 percent.
- Asians comprise three percent of the total K-12 ESP work force.
- Native Americans make up one percent of the nation's K-12 ESP.
- Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders comprise two tenths of one percent of all K-12 ESP.

- Three percent of the K-12 ESP work force report more than one race. (Respondents to the ACS can self-identify with any number of races, but the vast majority report a single race. Those who choose more than one usually specify only two races.)
- The largest percentages of minority K-12 ESP are found in the District of Columbia, Hawaii, and New Mexico.
- The lowest proportions of minority K-12 ESP are found in Maine, West Virginia, and Vermont.
- Seventy-two percent of K-12 ESP in the District of Columbia and 52 percent in Mississippi are Black.
- In New Mexico, Hispanic K-12 ESP make up 62 percent of the K-12 ESP work force; the corresponding share in Texas is 52 percent.
- In Hawaii, 44 percent of K-12 ESP are Asian, 17 percent are Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, and 22 percent report two or more races. Eleven percent of K-12 ESP in Alaska and eight percent in California are Asian.
- Twenty-three percent of K-12 ESP in Alaska, 13 percent in South Dakota, and 11 percent in New Mexico are Native American.

Tables 3-5a and 3-5b detail the racial-ethnic composition of the K-12 ESP work force by gender, across the 50 states and the District of Columbia.

- The distribution by race of female K-12 ESP is similar to that of the national K-12 ESP work force.
- There is a slightly larger percentage of minority workers among male K-12 ESP than in the national K-12 ESP work force.

Educational Attainment

Figure 3-4 and Tables 3-6a and 3-6b illustrate the educational attainment of the K-12 ESP work force, by state.

- Ninety-three percent of the total K-12 ESP work force has completed high school.
- Thirty-three percent have a college degree.
- At least 45 percent of K-12 ESP in New Hampshire and Massachusetts hold a college degree. Connecticut and Vermont follow, at around 42 percent.
- Louisiana and West Virginia have the lowest percentages of K-12 ESP with college degrees.
- Texas has the highest percentage of K-12 ESP that have not finished high school.

Household Income

Tables 3-7a and 3-7b show household total income for the K-12 ESP work force, by state. Factors such as household size and the number and gender of the earners in the household are additional sources of variability.

- Eighty-four percent of the nation's K-12 ESP live in households earning at least \$45,000 per year.
- Sixty-four percent of K-12 ESP live in households earning at least \$75,000 per year.
- Six percent of K-12 ESP live in households with an income of less than \$25,000.
- In six states and the District of Columbia, at least 90 percent of K-12 ESP have household incomes of at least \$45,000—New Jersey, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Connecticut, Washington, and Alaska.
- The highest percentage of K-12 ESP living in households with an income of less than \$15,000 is seen in North Dakota, at five percent.
- K-12 ESP in Hawaii have the highest average household income, at over \$150,000 per year, followed by Massachusetts, New Jersey, and Connecticut, at over \$140,000. In Mississippi, K-12 ESP household income averages less than \$77,000 per year.

Poverty Status

Figure 3-5 and Tables 3-8a and 3-8b detail the poverty status of all K-12 ESP, by state. Most K-12 ESP households earn sufficient income to keep them above the official U.S. government poverty threshold. Table 3-8a includes a “not ascertained” column, representing people for whom poverty status could not be determined.

- Seventy-nine percent of all K-12 ESP live in households with incomes at least twice the poverty threshold, and 42 percent have household incomes at least four times the threshold.
- In every state and the District of Columbia, at least 58 percent of K-12 ESP have household incomes at least twice the poverty level.
- In 28 states and the District of Columbia, at least 40 percent of K-12 ESP have household incomes four times the poverty level or higher.
- Six percent of all K-12 ESP, over 131,000, fall below the poverty line.
- Fifteen percent of K-12 ESP in Mississippi and 13 percent in Louisiana live below the poverty threshold, as do at least nine percent in North Dakota, Arkansas, and Georgia.

Marital Status

Tables 3-9a and 3-9b show the marital status of all K-12 ESP, by state.

- Sixty percent of all K-12 ESP are married.
- Eighteen percent are widowed, divorced, or separated.
- Twenty-two percent of all K-12 ESP have never married.
- In the District of Columbia, 62 percent of K-12 ESP are single. Other states with higher shares of single K-12 ESP are Hawaii, Rhode Island, California, and Alaska.
- In Montana, Nevada, and Louisiana, around 23 percent of K-12 ESP are widowed, divorced, or separated.

Household Relationship

Tables 3-10a and 3-10b show the household relationships of all K-12 ESP, by state.

- Forty-nine percent of the K-12 ESP work force are household heads.
- Thirty percent are spouses of the household head.
- Twenty percent are children or other household members.
- K-12 ESP in West Virginia, Arkansas, and Maine lead in percentage of household heads, at around 59 percent.
- Ohio leads in K-12 ESP who identify themselves as spouses of household heads, at 38 percent.
- Ranging from 33 to 40 percent, Hawaii, Alaska, and the District of Columbia have the highest percentages of K-12 ESP who describe their household relationship as “child or other household member,” such as living with parents, siblings, or non-relative roommates. K-12 ESP in California follow, at 30 percent.






K-12 ESP Work Force by State, 2021



Demographics of the 2021 K-12 ESP Work Force, by Career Family

Demographics by Career Family K-12 ESP

Tables 4-1a and 4-1b present distributions of descriptive variables for the national K-12 ESP work force, by career family.

- Transportation has the highest average age among K-12 ESP and technical services the lowest; see *Figure 4-1*.
- Female ESP predominate among clerical services, food services, health and student services, and paraeducator K-12 ESP, while the trades, security services, custodial, and technical services career families are disproportionately male. The distribution by sex among transportation services K-12 ESP is nearly equal; see *Figure 4-2*.
- In four career families, at least 30 percent of male K-12 ESP are under 35 years of age. Among female K-12 ESP, 25 percent or less of any career family is under 35 years old, and at least 39 percent of all nine career families are between the ages of 35 and 54.
- The largest shares of minority K-12 ESP are found in the security, custodial, and food services career families; the lowest proportion is in skilled trades.
- Ninety-six percent of technical services and skilled trades and 92 percent of clerical services K-12 ESP have household incomes of \$45,000 or higher, compared to 73 percent of food services K-12 ESP.
- In every career family at least 66 percent of K-12 ESP have household incomes twice the poverty level or higher; however, 11 percent of food services K-12 ESP live in poverty.
- The highest proportion of K-12 ESP participating in SNAP (*the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program*, formerly known as Food Stamps) is among the food services career family, at 17 percent; the lowest shares are among technical services, at five percent.




Figure 4-3**Educational Attainment of the K-12 ESP Work Force,

- Among K-12 ESP, technical, health and student services, clerical services, paraeducators, and security services lead in shares with college degrees. Custodial and food services K-12 ESP have the highest proportions that have not completed high school; see *Figure 4-3*.
- Around 69 percent of skilled trades and clerical services K-12 ESP are married; technical services and paraeducators, with the youngest average ages, have the highest proportion of single people at 28 percent.
- Food services K-12 ESP have the fewest hours, with 34 percent working fewer than 30 hours per week; 93 percent of trades, 86 percent of custodial services, and 83 percent of technical services K-12 ESP work 40 or more hours per week; see *Figure 4-4*.

by Career Family: 2021**





Percent



2022–2023 Earnings of the Full-Time Higher Ed ESP Work Force

Earnings of **full-time higher education ESP** are shown in this chapter. Earnings are expressed in 2022 dollars.

Full-Time Higher Ed ESP Earnings


Figure 5-1**Earnings Rankings for Full-Time Workers

Figure 5-1 and *Table 5-1* show the 2022–2023 average earnings for the full-time Higher Ed ESP work force, ranked by state.

- Average earnings for the national Higher Ed ESP full-time work force are \$44,898.
- Full-time Higher Ed ESP in 20 states and the District of Columbia have earnings above the national average, and those in 30 states below.
- Connecticut leads in full-time Higher Ed ESP average earnings at \$53,022, followed by New Jersey at \$52,119 and California at \$50,858.
- Higher Ed ESP in Mississippi and South Dakota have the lowest average earnings, below \$37,000.

Tables *5-2a* and *5-2b* show the distributions of earnings for full-time Higher Ed ESP by state, represented by counts and percentages.

- Sixty-nine percent of Higher Ed ESP have average earnings of at least \$35,000; fifty percent average \$45,000 or more.
- Six percent have average earnings below \$15,000.

The 2021 Higher Ed ESP Work Force

In this chapter, data are shown for two different groups of Higher Ed ESP: all Higher Ed ESP regardless of hours worked, and full-time Higher Ed ESP who work at least 30 hours per week. Full-time and part-time status is based on the usual hours worked per week in the previous 12 months.

All Higher Ed ESP


Figure 6-1**Work Force Counts****Higher Ed ESP by State, 2021**


Figure 6-2**Work Force Percentage of National Total

Figures 6-1 and 6-2 show the size and relative percentages of the entire Higher Ed ESP work force, by state.

- California leads the country in numbers of Higher Ed ESP, with 11 percent of the national Higher Ed ESP work force. Texas contributes nine percent and New York and Florida each have five percent of the total.
- The top 10 states constitute over 50 percent of the national Higher Ed ESP work force: California, Texas, New York, Florida, Illinois, North Carolina, Georgia, Michigan, Ohio, and Virginia.

All Higher Ed ESP, by Career Family

Table 6-1a gives the size of the Higher Ed ESP career families nationally and in each state.

- Nearly 790,000 ESP work in higher education.
- Clerical services are the largest career family by far, at 298,836.
- Paraeducators are next with 158,029.
- Technical services account for 118,148.
- California leads in nearly every career family. Other top states are Texas, New York, and Florida.

Nationally, the top three career families account for nearly three-quarters of Higher Ed ESP, as shown in *Table 6-1b*.

- Clerical services make up 38 percent of the total.
- Paraeducators add 20 percent.
- Technical services personnel make up 15 percent and custodial services 12 percent of the Higher Ed ESP workforce.
- Trades, food services, health and student services, security, and transportation together make up the remaining 15 percent share.
- This same general pattern is found at the state level, with the highest shares of Higher Ed ESP in the clerical, paraeducator, technical, and custodial career families.


Figure 6-3**Percentage Full-Time****Higher Ed ESP Work Force by State, 2021**

Figure 6-3 and Tables *6-2a* and *6-2b* give the counts and percentages of full-time Higher Ed ESP by state.

- Sixty-six percent of the nation's Higher Ed ESP work at least 30 hours per week.
- In 13 states and the District of Columbia 70 percent or more of Higher Ed ESP are full-time workers.
- New Jersey, Alaska, North Dakota, and the District of Columbia have the highest percentages of full-time Higher Ed ESP, at 75 percent or higher.
- Hawaii and Maine have the lowest percentages of full-time Higher Ed ESP, at less than 50 percent.
- California leads with 58,196 full-time Higher Ed ESP.
- More than half of the nation's full-time Higher Ed ESP work force is concentrated in 10 states: California, Texas, Florida, New York, North Carolina, Illinois, Georgia, Ohio, Michigan, and Pennsylvania.


Figure 6-4**Average Hours Worked****Higher Ed ESP Work Force by State, 2021**

Figure 6-4 shows the average hours worked by all Higher Ed ESP, by state.

- The national Higher Ed ESP work force averages 32 hours of work per week.
- Higher Ed ESP in North Carolina, Tennessee, and Alaska work an average of 35 to 36 hours per week.
- Higher Ed ESP in 11 states average 34 hours per week.
- Higher Ed ESP in Vermont work the fewest hours per week, at 27 hours.

Tables *6-3a* and *6-3b* give the distribution of Higher Ed ESP and hours worked in counts and percentages, by state.

- Nationally, 57 percent of Higher Ed ESP work at least 40 hours per week.
- Nine percent work between 30 and 39 hours per week.
- Thirty-four percent work fewer than 30 hours per week.
- At least 12 percent of Higher Ed ESP in Idaho, West Virginia, Vermont, and Wyoming work 45 or more hours per week.
- At least 50 percent of Higher Ed ESP in Hawaii, Maine, Vermont, Wyoming, and South Dakota work fewer than 30 hours per week.

Higher Ed ESP by State, 2021**

Demographics of the 2021 Higher Ed ESP Work Force

Age


Figure 7-1**Average Age****Higher Ed ESP Work Force by State, 2021**

Figure 7-1 and Tables 7-1a and 7-1b show the average and distribution of ages of the total Higher Ed ESP work force, by state.

- The national Higher Ed ESP work force averages 38 years old, 10 years younger than K-12 ESP.
- Thirty percent of Higher Ed ESP are under 25.
- Thirty percent are between age 35 to 54.
- Twenty percent of Higher Ed ESP are 55 years of age or older.
- The Higher Ed ESP work forces in New Jersey, Delaware, Rhode Island, and Maryland have the highest average age, at 41.
- Higher Ed ESP in Vermont have the lowest average age, at 27. Their counterparts in South Dakota and Wyoming average 31 years old.

Gender


Figure 7-2**Gender: Percentage Female

Figure 7-2 and Tables 7-2, 7-3a, and 7-3b present gender and age data for the total Higher Ed ESP work force, by state.

- Fifty-six percent of the total Higher Ed ESP work force is female.
- Seventy-four percent of the Rhode Island Higher Ed ESP work force and around 69 percent in Maine, New Hampshire, and Alaska are female. In another six states at least 60 percent of Higher Ed ESP are female.
- Fifty percent of West Virginia and Indiana Higher Ed ESP are male, along with 66 percent in the District of Columbia.
- In general, male Higher Ed ESP are slightly younger than female Higher Ed ESP.
- The gender by age distribution of Higher Ed ESP in most states mirrors the national pattern, but the ratios of the gender/age groups vary in some states.

Race/Ethnicity

Figure 7-3 and Tables 7-4a and 7-4b show the racial-ethnic composition of the Higher Ed ESP work force, by state.

- Minority workers make up 41 percent of the nation's Higher Ed ESP work force.
- Hispanics comprise the largest proportion, at 15 percent.
- Thirteen percent of Higher Ed ESP are Black.
- Asians comprise nine percent of the total Higher Ed ESP work force.
- Native Americans make up one percent of the nation's Higher Ed ESP.

- Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders comprise two tenths of a percent of all Higher Ed ESP.
- Four percent of the Higher Ed ESP work force report more than one race.
- The largest percentage of minority Higher Ed ESP is found in Hawaii, followed by California, New Mexico, Delaware, and Texas.
- The lowest proportions of minority Higher Ed ESP are found in Montana, West Virginia, and New Hampshire, all at less than 12 percent.
- Forty-one percent of Higher Ed ESP in Mississippi are Black.
- In New Mexico, Hispanic Higher Ed ESP make up 53 percent of the Higher Ed ESP work force.
- In Hawaii, 49 percent of Higher Ed ESP are Asian, nine percent are Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, and 15 percent report two or more races. Twenty-three percent of Higher Ed ESP in Alaska and 20 percent in California are Asian.
- Twenty-two percent of Higher Ed ESP in Alaska, six percent in Delaware, and five percent in Oklahoma are Native American.

Tables 7-5a and 7-5b detail the racial-ethnic composition of the Higher Ed ESP work force by gender, across the 50 states and the District of Columbia.

- The gender-specific distribution of Higher Ed ESP by race closely mirrors the national Higher Ed ESP work force.
- There is much variation in Higher Ed ESP racial/ethnic and gender distribution at the state level.

Educational Attainment

Figure 7-4 and Tables 7-6a and 7-6b illustrate the educational attainment of the Higher Ed ESP work force, by state.

- Ninety-seven percent of the total Higher Ed ESP work force has completed high school.
- Fifty-one percent of Higher Ed ESP have a college degree.
- At least 60 percent of Higher Ed ESP in North Dakota, Alaska, and Idaho hold college degrees, as do at least 55 percent in 12 other states.
- Vermont, Maine, and Montana have the lowest percentages of Higher Ed ESP with college degrees, at less than 35 percent.
- The highest percentages of Higher Ed ESP that have not finished high school are in the District of Columbia, Montana, and Rhode Island.

Household Income

Tables 7-7a and 7-7b show household total income for the Higher Ed ESP work force, by state. Factors such as household size and the number and gender of the earners in the household are additional sources of variability.

- Eighty-one percent of the nation's Higher Ed ESP live in households earning at least \$45,000 per year.
- Sixty-three percent of Higher Ed ESP live in households earning at least \$75,000 per year.
- Eight percent of Higher Ed ESP live in households with an income of less than \$25,000.
- New Jersey, Alaska, and Delaware lead in Higher Ed ESP with household incomes of at least \$45,000, each at 94 percent or higher.
- South Dakota at 15 percent and North Dakota at nine percent have the highest percentages of Higher Ed ESP living in households with an income of less than \$15,000.
- Higher Ed ESP in New Jersey, Hawaii, and the District of Columbia have the highest average household incomes, at more than \$150,000 per year. In six other states, Higher Ed ESP average more than \$136,000 in household income.
- In Vermont, Higher Ed ESP household incomes average below \$70,000 per year.

Poverty Status


Figure 7-5**Poverty Rate****Higher Ed ESP Work Force by State, 2021**

Figure 7-5 and Tables 7-8a and 7-8b detail the poverty status of all Higher Ed ESP, by state. Most Higher Ed ESP households earn sufficient income to keep them above the official U.S. government poverty threshold. *Table 7-8a* includes a “not ascertained” column, representing people for whom poverty status could not be determined.

- Seventy-seven percent of all Higher Ed ESP live in households with incomes at least twice the poverty threshold; forty-five percent have household incomes at least four times the threshold.
- In every state and the District of Columbia, at least 52 percent of Higher Ed ESP have household incomes at least twice the poverty level.
- Eleven percent of all Higher Ed ESP, over 75,000, fall below the poverty line.
- At least 24 percent of Higher Ed ESP in Wyoming, Vermont, and South Dakota live below the poverty threshold.

Marital Status

Tables 7-9a and 7-9b show the marital status of all Higher Ed ESP, by state.

- Thirty-nine percent of all Higher Ed ESP are married.
- Eleven percent are widowed, divorced, or separated.
- Fifty percent of all Higher Ed ESP have never married.
- In Vermont and Maine, at least 70 percent of Higher Ed ESP are single.

Household Relationship

Tables 7-10a and 7-10b show the household relationships of all Higher Ed ESP, by state.

- Forty-six percent of the Higher Ed ESP work force are household heads.
- Sixteen percent are spouses of the household head.
- Thirty-eight percent describe their household relationship as “child or other household member,” such as living with parents, siblings, or non-relative roommates.
- North Dakota and Alaska lead in percentage of household heads, at 62 percent or higher.
- Alaska, Pennsylvania, Iowa, and the District of Columbia lead in Higher Ed ESP who identify themselves as spouses of household heads, at 20 percent or more.
- At around 68 percent, Vermont and Hawaii have the highest percentages of Higher Ed ESP who describe their household relationship as “child or other household member.” The corresponding shares for Higher Ed ESP in New Hampshire, Maine, and Montana are at least 56 percent.






Higher Ed ESP Work Force by State, 2021**

Demographics of the 2021 Higher Ed ESP Work Force, by Career Family

Demographics by Career Family Higher Ed ESP

Tables 8-1a and 8-1b present distributions of descriptive variables of the national Higher Ed ESP work force, by career family.

- Skilled trades, custodial services, and transportation services have the highest average ages among Higher Ed ESP, and paraeducators the lowest; see *Figure 8-1*.
- Female ESP predominate among health and student services, clerical services, and food services Higher Ed ESP, while the trades, transportation, security services, custodial, and technical services career families are disproportionately male. The distribution by sex among paraeducator Higher Ed ESP is more equal; see *Figure 8-2*.
- In four career families, 50 percent or more of male Higher Ed ESP are under 35 years of age; this is true for female Higher Ed ESP in five career families.
- The largest shares of minority Higher Ed ESP are found in the food services, custodial, and security career families; the lowest proportion is in skilled trades.
- At least 90 percent of health and student services, technical services, skilled trades, and security Higher Ed ESP have household incomes of \$45,000 or higher, compared to 63 percent of paraeducators.
- In six career families at least 76 percent of Higher Ed ESP have household incomes twice the poverty level or higher; however, 23 percent of paraeducators and 16 percent of food services Higher Ed ESP live in poverty. These shares are likely due to the concentration of students in these jobs, a population known to report much higher rates of poverty than non-student ESP.
- The highest proportions of Higher Ed ESP participating in SNAP are among the food services and custodial services career families, at 11 percent or higher; four Higher Ed ESP career families are at four percent.




Figure 8-3**Educational Attainment of the Higher Ed ESP Work Force,

- Among Higher Ed ESP, health and student services and technical services lead in shares with college degrees. Custodial services Higher Ed ESP have the highest proportions that have not completed high school; see *Figure 8-3*.
- In six career families, at least 47 percent of Higher Ed ESP are married; paraeducators and food services, with the youngest average ages, have the highest proportions of single people.
- Paraeducator Higher Ed ESP have the fewest hours, with 66 percent working fewer than 30 hours per week; 83 percent of trades and 76 percent of custodial services Higher Ed ESP work 40 or more hours per week; see *Figure 8-4*.

by Career Family: 2021**



by Sex: 2021**



Percent



2022–2023 Earnings of the Full-Time ESP Work Force

Earnings of **all ESP who work full time** are shown in this chapter. Earnings are expressed in 2022 dollars.

Full-Time ESP Earnings


Figure 9-1**Earnings Rankings for Full-Time Workers****Total ESP Work Force by State, 2022–2023**

Figure 9-1 shows the 2022–2023 average earnings for the full-time ESP work force, ranked by state.

- The District of Columbia leads in ESP average earnings, followed by Delaware, New Jersey, Alaska, Connecticut, and California.
- ESP in Oklahoma, Mississippi, and Kentucky have the lowest average earnings.

The state ranks of average earnings for full-time ESP are shown for K-12 ESP and their higher education counterparts in *Table 9-1*.

- Average earnings for the national ESP full-time work force are \$35,995.
- Full-time ESP in 21 states and the District of Columbia have earnings above the national average, and those in 29 states below.
- ESP average earnings across the nation range from \$29,364 in Mississippi to \$44,710 in the District of Columbia.
- Average earnings in the District of Columbia may be among the leaders in results because of several factors. First there are the unique qualities of the District as a city, versus the mix of urban and rural natures of states. Also, the sample size for DC is small, with just 142 full-time ESP, so single respondents with high earnings may have large effects on averages.

Tables 9-2a and 9-2b show the distributions of earnings for full-time ESP by state, represented by counts and percentages.

- Forty-six percent of full-time ESP have average earnings of \$35,000 and over.
- Eleven percent of full-time ESP have average earnings below \$15,000.

The 2021 ESP Work Force

In this chapter, data are shown for two different groups of ESP: all ESP regardless of hours worked, and full-time ESP who work at least 30 hours per week. Full-time and part-time status is based on the usual hours worked per week in the previous 12 months.

All ESP





Figure 10-2**Work Force Percentage of National Total****Total ESP by State, 2021**

Figures 10-1 and 10-2 show the size and relative percentages of the entire ESP work force, by state.

- California, Texas, and New York lead the country in share of ESP, with 12 percent, 10 percent, and seven percent respectively, of the national ESP work force.
- The top 10 states constitute over 50 percent of the national ESP work force: California, Texas, New York, Florida, Illinois, Georgia, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and New Jersey.

All ESP, by Level

Tables 10-1a and 10-1b show the distribution of all ESP by level for the nation and individual states.

- Nearly 3.1 million ESP work in the nation's public schools and colleges.
- Nearly 2.3 million work at the K-12 level.
- Nearly 790,000 ESP work in higher education.
- The percentage contribution to national totals from each state is similar for K-12 and higher education ESP.

All ESP, by Career Family

Table 10-2a gives the size of the ESP career families nationally and in each state.

- Paraeducators are the largest career family, at 1,096,743.
- Clerical personnel are next with 669,018.
- Custodial services account for 443,597.
- Food services employ 277,962.
- California, Texas, or New York lead in nearly every career family. Florida and Illinois also rank highly.

Nationally, the top two career families account for over half of ESP, as shown in Table 10-2b.

- Paraeducators have 36 percent of the total.
- Clerical personnel make up 22 percent.
- Custodial services add 14 percent.

- Food services are another nine percent.
- Transportation and technical services ESP each account for seven percent.
- Skilled trades, security, and health and student services ESP together make up the remaining six percent share.
- This same general pattern is found at the state level, with the highest numbers of ESP in the paraeducator, clerical, and custodial career families.

Full-Time ESP


Figure 10-3**Percentage Full-Time****Total ESP Work Force by State, 2021**

Figure 10-3 and Tables *10-3a* and *10-3b* give the counts and percentages of full-time ESP by state.

- Seventy-six percent of the nation's ESP work at least 30 hours per week.
- At least 80 percent of ESP in 16 states and the District of Columbia are full-time workers.
- Texas, South Carolina, Mississippi, and Alaska have the highest shares of full-time ESP at 84 percent or more of their ESP work forces, after the District of Columbia at 90 percent.
- Utah has the lowest percentages of full-time ESP, at 53 percent.
- California and Texas have the highest counts of full-time ESP, each at over 252,600.
- While California leads in numbers of full-time ESP it has the fifth smallest share, at 69 percent.
- Half of the nation's full-time ESP work force is concentrated in nine states, led by California, Texas, New York, and Florida.

Hours Worked, All ESP


Figure 10-4**Average Hours Worked****Total ESP Work Force by State, 2021**

Figure 10-4 shows the average hours worked by all ESP, by state.

- The national ESP work force averages 34 hours of work per week.
- ESP in Texas, Mississippi, and the District of Columbia work the most hours, averaging around 37 hours per week.
- ESP in 10 states average around 36 hours per week.
- ESP in Utah work the fewest hours per week, 30 hours on average.

Tables *10-4a* and *10-4b* give the distribution of ESP and hours worked in counts and percentages, by state.

- Nationally, 54 percent of ESP work at least 40 hours per week.

- Twenty-two percent work between 30 and 39 hours per week.
- Twenty-four percent work fewer than 30 hours per week.
- Nine percent of ESP in Nebraska, Oklahoma, Kansas, Texas, Vermont, and the District of Columbia work 45 or more hours per week.
- Forty-seven percent of ESP in Utah and 34 percent in Michigan work fewer than 30 hours per week.

Total ESP by State, 2021

Demographics of the 2020 ESP Work Force

Age


Figure 11-1**Average Age****Total ESP Work Force by State, 2020**

Figure 11-1 and Tables 11-1a and 11-1b show the average and distribution of ages of the total ESP work force, by state.

- The national ESP work force averages 45 years old.
- Forty percent of ESP are between age 35 to 54.
- Thirteen percent are under 25.
- Eight percent of ESP are 65 years of age or older.
- The New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Virginia ESP work forces have the highest average ages, at around 48 years old.
- ESP in Utah and Wyoming average around 40 years of age.

Gender


Figure 11-2**Gender: Percentage Female****Total ESP Work Force by State, 2020**

Figure 11-2 and Tables 11-2, 11-3a, and 11-3b present gender and age data for the total ESP work force, by state.

- Sixty-nine percent of the total ESP work force is female.
- At least 74 percent of the Tennessee, Louisiana, and New Hampshire ESP work forces are female.
- Montana, West Virginia, Alaska, and the District of Columbia have the highest percentages of male ESP, from 36 to 41 percent.
- In general, male ESP are younger than female ESP. Thirty-four percent of males are under 35 years old, versus 25 percent of females.
- The gender by age distribution of ESP in individual states generally mirrors the national pattern.

Race/Ethnicity

Figure 11-3 and Tables 11-4a and 11-4b show the racial-ethnic composition of the ESP work force, by state.

- Minority workers make up 41 percent of the nation's ESP work force.
- Hispanics comprise an 19 percent and Blacks a 14 percent share of total ESP.
- Four percent of the national ESP work force is Asian.
- Native Americans make up one percent of the nation's ESP.
- Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders comprise two tenths of a percent of all ESP.
- Three percent of the total ESP work force report more than one race.
- The largest percentages of minority ESP are found in Hawaii, the District of Columbia, New Mexico, California, and Texas.

- The lowest proportions of minority ESP are found in West Virginia, Maine, New Hampshire, and Vermont.
- In New Mexico, Hispanic ESP make up 60 percent of the ESP workforce; the corresponding shares in Texas and California are 47 and 46 percent, respectively.
- Sixty-four percent of ESP in the District of Columbia and 49 percent in Mississippi are Black.
- In Hawaii, 46 percent of ESP are Asian, 15 percent are Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, and 20 percent identify themselves as belonging to two or more races. Thirteen percent of the Alaska and 11 percent of the California ESP work forces are Asian.
- Twenty-three percent of ESP in Alaska, 10 percent in South Dakota, and nine percent in New Mexico are Native American.

Tables 11-5a and 11-5b detail the racial-ethnic composition of the ESP work force by gender, across the 50 states and the District of Columbia.

- The gender-specific distribution of ESP by race closely mirrors the national ESP work force.
- There is much variation in ESP racial/ethnic and gender distribution at the state level.

Educational Attainment

Figure 11-4 and Tables 11-6a and 11-6b illustrate the educational attainment of the ESP work force, by state.

- Ninety-four percent of the total ESP work force has completed high school.
- Thirty-seven percent of ESP have a college degree.
- Forty-seven percent of ESP in North Dakota and at least 42 percent in nine other states have completed a college degree.
- Louisiana and West Virginia have the lowest percentages of ESP with college degrees, at less than 26 percent.
- The highest percentage of ESP that have not finished high school is in Texas, at 11 percent.

Household Income

Tables 11-7a and 11-7b show household total income for the ESP work force, by state. Factors such as household size and the number and gender of the earners in the household are additional sources of variability.

- Eighty-three percent of the nation's ESP live in households earning at least \$45,000 per year.
- Sixty-four percent of ESP live in households earning at least \$75,000 per year.
- Six percent of ESP live in households with an income of less than \$25,000.
- Around 90 percent of ESP in New Jersey, New Hampshire, Alaska, Washington, Massachusetts, Connecticut, and the District of Columbia have household incomes of at least \$45,000. In 12 other states, at least 85 percent of ESP live in households with incomes at least \$45,000.
- North Dakota, Louisiana, North Carolina, and Vermont have the highest shares of ESP living in households with an income of less than \$15,000, from four to six percent.
- ESP in Hawaii, New Jersey, and Massachusetts have the highest average household incomes, at over \$145,000 per year. In Mississippi, ESP household incomes average less than \$79,000 per year.

Poverty Status


Figure 11-5**Poverty Rate****Total ESP Work Force by State, 2020**

Figure 11-5 and Tables 11-8a and 11-8b detail the poverty status of all ESP, by state. Most ESP households earn sufficient income to keep them above the official U.S. government poverty threshold. Table 11-8a includes a “not ascertained” column, representing people for whom poverty status could not be determined.

- Seventy-eight percent of all ESP live in households with incomes at least twice the poverty threshold, and 43 percent have household incomes at least four times the threshold.
- In every state and the District of Columbia, at least 62 percent of ESP have household incomes at least twice the poverty level.
- Seven percent of all ESP, over 206,000, fall below the poverty line.
- In Mississippi, fourteen percent of ESP live below the poverty threshold; this figure is between 10 and 13 percent in Louisiana, North Dakota, and Alabama.

Marital Status

Tables *11-9a* and *11-9b* show the marital status of all ESP, by state.

- Fifty-five percent of all ESP are married.
- Sixteen percent are widowed, divorced, or separated.
- Twenty-nine percent of all ESP have never married.
- The District of Columbia, Hawaii, and Rhode Island have the highest shares of ESP who are single, at 40 percent or higher.

Household Relationship

Tables *11-10a* and *11-10b* show the household relationships of all ESP, by state.

- Forty-nine percent of the ESP work force are household heads.
- Twenty-seven percent are spouses of the household head.
- Twenty-five percent are children or other household members, such as persons living with parents, siblings, or non-relative roommates.
- North Dakota and Arkansas lead in percentage of household heads, at around 56 percent.
- Thirty-two percent of ESP in Wyoming, Indiana, Ohio, and Nebraska identify themselves as spouses of household heads.
- At 47 percent, Hawaii has the highest percentage of ESP who describe their household relationship as “child or other household member.”
ESP in California and the District of Columbia have a corresponding share of 34 percent or more.

Total ESP Work Force by State, 2020






Total ESP Work Force by State, 2020**

Demographics of the 2021 ESP Work Force, by Career Family

Demographics by Career Family Total ESP

Tables 12-1a and 12-1b present distributions of descriptive variables of the national ESP work force, by career family.

- Transportation has the highest average age among the nation's ESP, and technical services the lowest; see *Figure 12-1*.
- Female ESP predominate among food services, clerical services, health and student services, and paraeducator ESP, while the trades, security services, custodial, and technical services career families are disproportionately male. The distribution by sex among transportation services ESP is equal; see *Figure 12-2*.
- In four career families, over 42 percent of male ESP are under 35 years of age, while female ESP in eight career families are most likely to be between the ages of 35 and 54. This gender difference might reflect the concentration of older women in permanent positions, and the concentration of younger male students in temporary positions.
- The largest shares of minority ESP are found in the security, custodial, and food services career families; the lowest proportions are in technical services and skilled trades.
- Around 93 percent of technical services and trades ESP have household incomes of \$45,000 or higher, compared to 73 percent of food services ESP.
- In every career family at least 66 percent of ESP have household incomes twice the poverty level or higher; however, 12 percent of food services ESP live in poverty.
- The highest proportion of ESP participating in SNAP is among the food services career family, at 16 percent; the lowest shares are among skilled trades and technical services, at five percent.




Figure 12-3**Educational Attainment of the Total ESP Work Force,

- Technical and health and student services ESP lead in shares with college degrees. Custodial and food services ESP have the highest proportions that have not completed high school; see *Figure 12-3*.
- In every career family, at least 50 percent of ESP are married; technical services and paraeducators, with the youngest average ages, have the highest proportions of single people.
- Food services ESP have the fewest hours, with 35 percent working fewer than 30 hours per week; 89 percent of skilled trades and 84 percent of custodial services ESP work 40 or more hours per week; see *Figure 12-4*.

by Career Family: 2021**






