Missouri NEA advocates for state database detailing COVID-19 exposures and school closures

The Missouri National Education Association (Missouri NEA) released its "<u>COVID -19</u> <u>Exposures and Closures</u>" report detailing incidents of exposure to COVID-19 in local schools and school-related activities. The report, updated weekly, combines information from educators, parents, school districts, and local media.

"Missouri NEA began reporting incidents of COVID-19 exposure in our schools to inform parents and educators," said Phil Murray, president of the Missouri National Education Association. "We have reported more than 130 incidents of exposure to COVID-19. It is extremely distressing because we know it doesn't capture the true scope of school-related exposures, and signals the potential for increased risk as children return to school."

As a new school year begins, many parents are deciding between in-person or virtual education for their children. Parents are weighing the potential risk of exposure to COVID-19 against the benefits of available educational options. Parents and educators do not have all the information necessary to make an informed decision. Missouri NEA is calling on the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) and Governor Parson to require school districts to report COVID-19 incidents and create a public registry of school-related COVID-19 exposures.
